Bio-filmography

Screenplay writer and director of the 35 mm short film *La gotera* (1996), starring Dominique Pinon (*Delicatessen*). Nominated for Best Fiction Short Film at the XI Goya Awards (1997), it took part in the Official Section at over thirty national and international film festivals. They included Sitges, Hamptons (New York), Tampere, Toronto, London, Comicità (Rome), Geneva, Alcalá de Henares, Huesta, l'Alternativa de Barcelona, Experimentary Film Festival of Madrid, Fantastic Film Festival of Brussels or Huston, where it won five major awards.

Screenplay writer, director and actor in the 35 mm short film *Mustek* (1996). It also took part in several national and international festivals in 1997 and 1998 (Charleston, Houston, Madrid, etc.) where it won four prizes.

Screenplay writer for Boca Boca's series for Telecinco titled *Al salir de clase* (1999-2001).

Author of its screenplay, THE NIGHT OF THE SUNFLOWERS is his debut as the director of a feature film.

Director's Comments

THE NIGHT OF THE SUNFLOWERS is *cine noir* in a mountainous rural setting and also a film focused on its characters. Half thriller, half drama, it is about sudden changes in the fortunes of its eight main characters due to a dramatic event that gets increasingly complicated as they each progressively get involved in it. Attention has been paid to both the suspenseful plot throughout the film and the development of the characters, so we understand their reactions to the dilemmas they face.

The film has six parts: "The Man at the Motel", "The Cave Experts", "The Man on the Road", "The Proper Authorities", "Amos the Madman", and "The Alligator". A suspenseful plot connects all six parts with a final resolution that brings closure to each section. Each part is told from the point of view of one or two main characters, who play supporting roles in the other sections. This way, we learn about the characters' personal lives before they get caught up in the main plot, so we have a better understanding of their backgrounds and motivations. This is not a film with one lead and several supporting roles or a film about a group. Instead, this story has a set of protagonists who take turns telling their stories, like runners in a relay race. Their choices and reactions make the film take unexpected, inevitable sudden turns.

These are ordinary characters faced with extreme situations and perhaps one of the film's main aims is to explore how ordinary people create such a complex, dramatic situation. How do their circumstances and personal psychological and emotional mechanisms explain their behavior and, above all, allow them to justify what they do and go on living? This is not a film about good guys and bad guys. It's about very human characters with strengths and weaknesses. It is about how some of them believe they are highly principled but end up excusing despicable behavior. The film does not seek to justify or judge them; it not moralistic. It describes a certain moral climate, a certain state of things, and gives no answers or lectures but does ask us to think a little.

The film is also about violence, the kind that arises from our most basic instincts or is caused by an inability to communicate or see things from others' points of view. This senseless type of violence is portrayed very roughly. It cannot be excused as revenge or as a rewarding sight for the audience. It becomes an event with very unpleasant, dramatic consequences that permanently alter the lives of all the characters.

The film is also about loneliness, about the isolation of abandonment, and the unhappiness caused by longing for a different life. It is about our indifference to the slow, painful death of the rural way of life. About our false hopes that money from leisure activities and tourism will preserve it. But they cannot prevent the irretrievable loss of this way of life.
